This Winter at SHS

Barefoot in the Park is a romantic comedy by Neil Simon. The original Broadway production, directed by Mike Nichols, opened October 23, 1963, with the four lead roles taken by actors Elizabeth Ashley (Corie), Robert Redford (Paul), Mildred Natwick (Mrs. Banks), and Kurt Kasznar (Victor Velasco). The play was nominated for three 1964 Tony Awards, and Mike Nichols won the trophy for Best Director (Dramatic). The show ran for 1530 performances, closing on June 25, 1967, making it Neil Simon's longest-running hit, and the tenth longest-running non-musical play in Broadway history.

The Play

Inherit the Wind is a fictionalized account of the 1925 Scopes "Monkey" Trial, which resulted in John T. Scopes's conviction for teaching Charles Darwin's theory of evolution to a high school science class, contrary to a Tennessee state law that prohibited the teaching of evolution. The fictional characters Matthew Harrison Brady, Henry Drummond, Bertram Cates and E. K. Hornbeck correspond to the historical figures of William Jennings Bryan, Clarence Darrow, Scopes, and H. L. Mencken, respectively. However, the playwrights state in a note at the opening of the play that it is not meant to be an historical account. Their intent was to criticize the then current state of "McCarthyism" or anti-Communist investigations of the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) and Senator Joseph McCarthy. The authors used the historical Scopes trial as the background for a drama that comments on and explores the threats to intellectual freedom presented by the anti-communist hysteria. In 1996 Lawrence commented in an interview that, "we used the teaching of evolution as a parable, a metaphor for any kind of mind control [...] It's not about science versus religion. It's about the right to think."

SAYVILLE PLAYERS

SAYVILLE PLAYERS is the Sayville High School drama club and is open to any SHS student who is interested in drama and theatre arts. We produce five works per year: an opera or operetta in August (with the Sayville Young People's Opera Workshop), a full-length play (comedy or drama) in November, another full-length play (drama or comedy) in December or January, a musical (with the SHS Music Department) in March, and a Drama Festival (featuring one act plays directed by and sometimes written by senior drama students) in May. **Any SHS student may participate in any or all of these productions.**

MEMBERSHIP depends on participation either on stage or back stage or both. (Members of Stage Crew are also members of Sayville Players.) Once a student has participated in two productions, he or she is eligible for Probationary Membership. After a student has accrued 5 or more participation points in at least 3 productions, he or she is eligible to be an Active Member and he/she MUST participate in at least one production per year thereafter to maintain that status. All active members of SAYVILLE PLAYERS (including members of SHS STAGE CREW) are also eligible to belong to the INTERNATIONAL THESPIAN SOCIETY upon submission of a membership form and the required dues.

AWARDS are given each year for active participation in and outstanding contribution to the SHS theatre arts program at the SAYVILLE PLAYERS / INTERNATIONAL THESPIAN SOCIETY INSTALLATION AND AWARDS CEREMONY which will be on Wednesday June 1, 2011, at 7:30 P.M. in the high school auditorium and is open to the public.



SHS STAGE CREW

SHS STAGE CREW is Sayville High School's theatrical production crew responsible primarily for the scenery, lighting and special effects required for the various SAYVILLE PLAYERS productions. SHS STAGE CREW is also the standing stage crew for both the Little Theatre and the auditorium maintaining the equipment associated with those facilities and assisting any organization that uses either of those facilities, as well.

MEMBERSHIP in SHS STAGE CREW is based strictly on participation. All work calls are posted on the Stage Crew Call-Wall outside the Little Theatre and open to any SHS student who wants to work on a production.

This Spring at SHS

Crazy for You is a musical with a book by Ken Ludwig, lyrics by Ira Gershwin, and music by George Gershwin. Billed as "The New Gershwin Musical Comedy", it is largely based on the songwriting team's 1930 production, *Girl Crazy*, but interpolates songs from several other productions as well. *Crazy for You* won the 1992 Tony Award for Best Musical.

The Broadway production was directed by Mike Ockrent and choreographed by Susan Stroman. After 10 previews, it opened at the Shubert Theatre on February 19, 1992 and ran for 1,622 performances. The cast included Jodi Benson as Polly, Harry Groener as Bobby Child, Bruce Adler as Bela Zangler, John Hillner as Lank Hawkins, Michele Pawk as Irene Roth, Jane Connell as Mother, Beth Leavel as Tess (Leavel also understudied Benson), Ronn Carroll as Everett Baker, and Stephen Temperley and Amelia White as Eugene and Patricia Fodor. The Manhattan Rhythm Kings played cowboys Mingo, Moose, and Sam, singing in their trademark close harmony.

In his review in *The New York Times*, Frank Rich enthused, "When future historians try to find the exact moment at which Broadway finally rose up to grab the musical back from the British, they just may conclude that the revolution began last night. The shot was fired at the Shubert Theater, where a riotously entertaining show called *Crazy for You* uncorked the American musical's classic blend of music, laughter, dancing, sentiment and showmanship with a freshness and confidence rarely seen during the *Cats* decade . . . *Crazy for You* scrapes away decades of cabaret and jazz and variety-show interpretations to reclaim the Gershwins' standards, in all their glorious youth, for the dynamism of the stage."
