Music to the Ears!

This week, Mr. Campbell and Ms. Kinsella used popular, carefully chosen song lyrics to jazz up a unit on figurative language. As part of the fourth grade curriculum, students are asked to demonstrate an understanding of figurative language by explaining the meanings of simple similes and metaphors. It can often be difficult for young students to differentiate between literal and figurative language, especially for students with speech difficulties and English language learners. In listening to and reading select lyrics from songs by Bob Marley, Tom Petty, Gym Class Heroes and Jay Z, to name a few, students were actively engaged in identifying similes, metaphors and personification. Students were able to recognize personification in Bob Marley's Three Little Birds and the "concrete jungle" as a metaphor for New York City in Jay Z's Empire State of Mind. As a follow up activity, students were broken into small groups to use figurative language to describe elements in nature such as the sun, the moon, the ocean, a butterfly, an eagle, and a lion. They enjoyed working together to create their own song lyrics and were proud to share them with the class!


Lincoln Avenue to Celebrate
