## Table Ball!

Coming to a backyard party near you!


Mr. Slinkosky and Coach Bolger are currently working towards learning the game of ping pong in physical education classes. As a lead up game, we are teaching our students table ball. This activity focuses on hand eye coordination and is an activity that can be played at any age and/or at any gathering. The students love to use a variety of balls to play this activity. You can use balloons, kick balls, gator balls, and tennis balls or make it more difficult with an
irregular shaped ball. Stay active and play as a family! Have your child teach you at your next gathering!

Flashcards Are Boring......Not!


Are you trying to work on fact fluency at home? Are flashcards just not motivating your student? Try using the flashcards to play some of these games to increase your child's engagement and success. Flashcards can be found at most dollar stores or printed for free off the internet.
Top It! Shuffle up and deal out the flashcards. Each player flips over and solves their top card. The player with the higher answer wins both cards. If the cards have the same answer, each player flips another card. Play continues until one player has won all the cards.
Kaboom! Write Kaboom! on two or three post it notes and use them to cover a few easier facts. Shuffle the pile and place it fact up on the table. Each player takes turns drawing and solving a card. If correct, the player gets to keep the card. If you draw a Kaboom! card, then you must place all your cards at the bottom of the draw pile. This is a never ending game that provides repeated opportunities to solve the same facts.

The Answer Is... Show your child the answer side of the flashcard and have them guess the fact. If they can get it within 1 or 2
guesses they win the card. This works best when you focus on one or two fact sets (all cards are +4 or +3 , all cards are x 5 or X6).

Around and Around! Lay flashcards out in a big circle fact side up. On their turn, players roll a die and travel that many cards around the circle. They solve the card they land on. If correct they keep the card. If wrong they leave it in the circle. Winner has the most cards after all the cards have been picked up.

Slap It! (Best played with 3 or more people) Lay 4 or 5 cards out on the table fact side up. The "caller" says the answer to one of the cards. The players have to slap their hand over the card with the matching fact (also fun with a fly swatter). If they are first they keep the card. Keep replacing the cards on the table to keep the game going.

## Go Fish! (Use two decks of flash cards)

 This game is played much like traditional Go Fish!. The goal is to make matches of cards that have the same answer. Players request "a card that equals" the same as a card they are holding.All District Strings Concert January 30, 2019
